Funding for education, health and social services in most African countries has been too low for many years, with serious effects on people's basic rights. Millions of children, particularly girls, do not go to school.

Communities affected by HIV/AIDS are not getting the treatment and care that they urgently require. Long term and lasting investment in the people of Africa is needed to build a future for the continent.

Zambia Profile

- Over 70% of Zambians live in poverty
- life expectancy at birth (about 38 years)
- HIV/AIDS is the nation's greatest challenge, with 16% prevalence among the adult population.
- Zambia's total foreign debt stood at about \$7 billion when Zambia reached the Highly Indebted Poor Countries Initiative (HIPC) in April 2005.
- Millions of Zambians live below the World Bank poverty threshold of \$1 a day

The charity Oxfam has warned that the education system in Zambia is in a precarious state.

- Classrooms are often dilapidated and overcrowded, and teachers are badly paid and lacking motivation.
- Many of the poorest families cannot afford the fee charged by government institutions, so they have set up community schools where children are taught for free.
- But the conditions in these schools are even worse. There are often no books, no pens and pencils, no desks, no blackboards, and the teachers are untrained and unpaid.
- On a recent visit to the country, Glenys Kinnock, a British member of the European parliament, said she was appalled by the difficulties facing Zambia's children.
- The HIV/Aids pandemic is also taking its toll. Last year, more teachers died of Aids than passed through teacher training.

2001

- Itala had over 2000 children – most received no education.
 - State education had to be paid for – uniforms, books, exams – beyond the reach of children even if they had parents.
 - Most children were orphans of the aids pandemic.
 - Some local, mainly unqualified and unpaid, teachers trying their best to educate a few children in a roofless rented house.
 - Many adults also required education.
- § Our objectives in helping Itala
To widen the base of education provision in Itala.
- To provide education free or at low cost.
 - To provide an education to any person in the community.
 - To create a self funding education system in the village outside of the State system.

2002

Building of the first school using pupils from North Wales.

Development 2002 - 2004

- Acknowledgement that more needed to be done to achieve our aims and objectives.
- Fundraising appeals took place over the next couple of years.
- Very generous response from the Northern Ireland Public Service Administration.
- Funding brought together.
- Building plans sourced.

The ground is levelled and footings are dug by our pupils.

2006

- New desks and benches Used by the community.
- The new school houses four classrooms.
- Two teachers offices.

TODAY

- 779 students attend school each day 40% of children are being reached. (bellach yn 1010)
- Age range 7 - 16.
- working day 7:30 am – 5:00 pm.
- pupils asked for Kw 3500 (60p) per term.
- 170 students are entered for exams each year.
- school receives no financial aid from the government.
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FUTURE DEVELOPMENT

- Financial stability is essential to retaining teachers
- Female staffing required to improve the status of women and to act as a role model to female students – traditional roles have to change.
- Enticements needed to attract the orphans of the village.
- The opportunity for skill based as well as academic learning.
- Adult education classes.
- Accommodation for orphans.
- New classroom block.
